WHEN TO GO

Lebanon's Mediterranean climate has mild, wet winters with snow in the mountains and hot and dry summers. The climate is generally cooler and wetter in the mountainous areas. There are more than 300 days of sunshine a year.

- **CURRENCY:** Lebanese pound. £1 = L£2,120.
- ▶ TIME: GMT +2.

LANGUAGE: Arabic. English and French are widely spoken throughout the country.

▶ INTERNATIONAL DIAL CODE: 00 961.

RED TAPE: Visa required and issued on arrival or from the Lebanese Embassy in London.

Middle East Airlines, BA and BMI operate services from Heathrow to Beirut.

FLYING TIME: Around 4h30m.

GETTING AROUND

There are several buses and minibuses available in Beirut and on inter-city routes. You can also use shared taxis and regular metered cabs not only in cities but to travel anywhere in the country. These or chauffeured hotel limos are the best option when travelling around. Car hire is available in Beirut, but is not recommended.
